Who is a Parish Mission for?

A Parish Mission is for people of all ages and stages of life – married, single, divorced, separated, widowed, young, or old. We especially welcome those who may want to know more about the Church today, and how it can take an active role in the everyday experiences of work, leisure, family, and politics.

As a keyboard musician, Fr. John brings music to his ministry and has served as pastoral musician for national and international Franciscan celebrations. For over 30 years, John was a regular contributor to Sunday and Weekly "Homily Helps" for priests published by *Franciscan Media* of Cincinnati, OH. And, since 1998, he has worked on the staff of the *Franciscan Pilgrimage Program* directing educational and spiritual opportunities in Assisi, Italy, for Franciscans and lovers of St. Francis and St. Clare, throughout the calendar year.



Fr. John is a member of St. Augustine Province of the Capuchin Franciscans (centered in Pittsburgh) and lives with three other friars at his Province's St. Ambrose Friary in Baltimore, MD.
